## CURRENT NUMBER OF BOARD CERTIFIED GERIATRICIANS BY STATE

A geriatrician is a physician who is specially trained to evaluate and manage the unique healthcare needs and treatment preferences of older people. Geriatricians are board-certified internists or family physicians who have additional training and certification in geriatrics.

As of 2018, there were 7,298 certified geriatricians in the United States.<sup>1,2</sup>

The table below reflects the number of physicians by state with an active American Board of Family Medicine (ABFM) or American Board of Internal Medicine (ABIM) certification as well as a subspecialty certification in geriatrics. In addition to these 6,952 ABIM/ABFM-certified geriatricians, there are 346 certified osteopathic geriatricians.<sup>2</sup>
